starting on 1st October 2022. The chair is part of the Department of German and Comparative Literature and Culture.

The discipline 'German Medieval Studies' is to be represented in its entire scope in research as well as teaching. The research focus is expected to be on German literature of the early and high Middle Ages and its cultural contexts. In addition, we expect experience in the acquisition and carrying out of externally funded research projects, willingness to collaborate in the transdisciplinary research networks of the university, and active participation in the development of further interdisciplinary initiatives. Didactic aptitude, teaching experience, and a willingness to commit oneself to the department's internal and inter-departmental study programs are indispensable. Furthermore, willingness to participate in academic self-administration is required. Involvement in the internationalization strategy of the department is desirable.

Application requirements are a relevant PhD and habilitation or equivalent academic achievements.

Prerequisites for employment are in accordance to Section 36 Higher Education Act NRW.
